



## ASIA NEW ZEALAND FOUNDATION HONORARY ADVISERS

### Purpose

To provide advice, knowledge, influence, and prestige to the Foundation in their countries of appointment.

To provide access to networks at the most senior levels in their countries of appointment, and beyond, for the Foundation, for New Zealand Government ministers, and for New Zealand Heads of Mission.

To provide support for Foundation activities.

To provide support for senior visitors from the Foundation in the pursuit of Foundation goals.

To provide advice and guidance on Foundation fund-raising in their country of appointment and beyond.

### Experience

Holding a leading position in business, academic or political circles in their country of appointment, or in the wider region.

Having a knowledge of New Zealand, and/or a sympathy for New Zealand, which is/are such as to motivate them to advance New Zealand interests in their country of appointment.

Having had a career of distinction and repute which has led them to interact with New Zealanders in ways which have contributed to New Zealand's interests.

### Conditions of appointment

An Honorary Advisor is not remunerated for his/her activities on behalf of the Foundation, nor does he/she expect remuneration.

An Honorary Advisor is expected to be in contact with the Foundation, and with the New Zealand Head of Mission in their country of appointment, on a reasonable basis. This contact may be generated by the Foundation or the Head of Mission, or by the Honorary Advisor.

The term of appointment is for five years.

It is expected that Honorary Advisors will visit New Zealand at least once during their term of appointment. The Foundation will pay the costs associated with that visit, if necessary. During the visit, the Honorary Advisor will undertake a reasonable programme of activities to advance the Foundation's interests.

It is expected that Honorary Advisors will make themselves available, on a reasonable and appropriate basis, to attend the Honorary Advisors' meetings arranged by the Foundation. These meetings may take place in New Zealand or Asia once every two years. Attendance at these meetings will be at the Foundation's expense.
