In Tuho, the players try to cast the arrows into the hole of a narrow-necked wooden jar.

The score is determined by counting the number of arrows collected in the jar. It looks easy, but the hole is quite small and to throw the arrows accurately to make it go into the hole is not as easy as it seems, for it requires good concentration and patience.

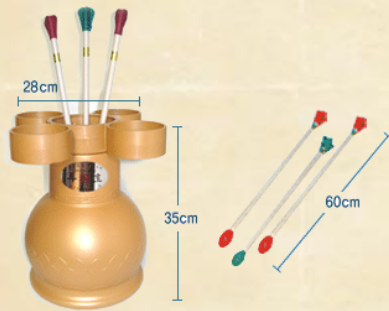
How to play

1. Players throw the arrows into the pot. The winner of the game is the player who puts arrows the most times into the pot.
2. The game can be played individually or in teams by adding up the scores.

The game is a traditional diversion on [Korean New Year's Day](#) and [Chuseok](#). Modern versions are often played with a simple canister and rubber-tipped arrows. The arrows used are usually between 50 and 60 cm long, and are thrown at the arrow vase from around ten paces away.
